There are three distinct online resources detailing the region's history and genealogy.

These three resources can be found at www.kentonlibrary.org/genealogy listed under the "Online Searching" heading.

The Northern Kentucky Newspaper Index –

Newspapers from the 14-county region of Northern Kentucky, including *The Kentucky Post* and *The Kentucky Enquirer* are available for viewing online. The site has over 900,000 articles indexed, with digital images available for many of the older newspapers, such as *The Covington Journal*, *Ticket*, and the *Daily Commonwealth*.

Photographic Archive –

Search the indexed database of more than 45,000 images of local photographs, some dating back to the 1880s. Each image includes identifying information such as names, dates, locations and subject when available.



GeNKY Database – Military records, census indexes, city directory abstracts, and local cemetery records are among the 250,000 entries included in the GeNKY Database. Library staff and volunteers are continually adding to this extensive database.

Additionally the Library subscribes to Ancestry Library Edition (accessible in Library only) and Heritage Quest (accessible from home and Library).

The Kenton County Public Library is the leading resource in Northern Kentucky for local history and genealogy information. Housed in Covington at the Mary Ann Mongan Library, the Kentucky History and Genealogy Department offers more than 20,000 volumes of historical facts and 8,000 reels of microfilm. Additionally the department offers various online databases so researchers can access information from anywhere in the world through the Library's website, www.kentonlibrary.org/genealogy.

The Library's collection, books and documents, includes photographs, family files, maps, microforms, and art work. There are extensive resources regarding Civil War veterans, cemetery and church records and Census data.
